Quote Joshua 1:7	“Only be thou strong and very courageous, that thou mayest observe to do according to all the law, which Moses my servant commanded thee: turn not from it to the right hand or to the left, that thou mayest prosper withersoever thou goest.”
Quote Joshua 1:8	This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth: but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success.
What was the name of the river that the children of Israel had to cross over to enter the promised land? Joshua 1:11	Jordan
Two and one-half tribes were not going to take possession of land on the other side of the Jordan. Which tribes are they? Joshua 1: 12 & 12	Reuben, Gad, and One half of Manasseh
How many spies did Joshua send into Jericho? Joshua 2:1	Two
Where did Joshua send the two spies? Joshua 2:1	Jericho
Who hid the spies from the king of Jericho? Joshua 2:3 & 4	Rahab
Where did Rahab hide the spies? Joshua 2:6	On the roof of her house
Why was she willing to hide the spies? Joshua 2:12	She wanted her family to be safe when the children of Israel invaded their country.
Where did Rahab live? Joshua 2:15	Her house was upon the town wall.
How did the spies finally escape? Joshua 2:15	Rahab let them out through the window and down the wall with a cord.

What sign was Rahab to use to show where her family was and therefore be safe? Joshua 2:18	She was to hang a scarlet cord in the window.
How did the army know when it was time to start moving? Joshua 3:3	When they saw the priests carrying the arc of the covenant.
How closely was the army to follow behind the arc of the covenant? Joshua 3:4	The army was not to come within two thousand cubits of the arc of the covenant.
When the priests came to the Jordan river what were they supposed to do? Joshua 3:8	QUOTE: “When ye are come to the brink of the water of Jordan, ye shall stand still in Jordan.”
How were the children of Israel to know that the living God was among them? Joshua 3:10	He would drive their enemies out of the promised land.
What would happen as soon of the priests put their feet into the Jordan river? Joshua 3:13-17	The water would divide and they could pass over the Jordan river on dry ground.
How many tribes of people were in the children of Israel? Joshua 4:2	12
Joshua selected 12 men, one from each tribe to do something immediately after they crossed the Jordan river, what was it? Joshua 4:3	They were to each get a stone out of the Jordan river from the place where the priests were standing.
What was the purpose of taking the stones out of the Jordan river? Joshua 4:6 & 7	It was to be a sign of remembrance that they had crossed the Jordan river on dry ground.
What did Joshua do with the stones that were taken out of the Jordan river? Joshua 4:9	He set them up as a memorial for future generations to see and understand what God had done for them.
How many men prepared for war from the tribes of Reuben, Gad and Manasseh passed through the Jordan river? Joshua 4:13	About 40,000
How did the kings of the enemy countries feel when they heard about the way in which the children of Israel crossed the Jordan? Joshua 5:1	Their hearts melted (their courage failed)

What did the children of Israel do on the fourteenth day of the month after crossing the Jordan river? Joshua 5:10	They kept the passover.
What did they eat on the day after the passover? Joshua 5:11	Old corn, unleavened cakes and parched corn
What happened the day after they ate the old corn? Joshua 5:12	The manna ceased. They never ate manna again. They ate of the fruit of the land of Canaan.
Why was the city of Jericho shut up? (All the gates were closed.) Joshua 6:1	Because they were afraid of the children of Israel.
What directions was Joshua given for defeating Jericho? Joshua 6:3-5	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) The men of war would walk around the city of Jericho one time each day for six days. 2) The priests would carry the arc of the covenant. 3) On the seventh day they would walk around the city seven times and the priests would blow their trumpets one long blast. 4) When the people heard the blast they were to all shout.
What would happen if they obeyed the orders for defeating Jericho? Joshua 6:5	The city walls would fall down.
How were they to march around Jericho for the first six days? Joshua 6:10 & 13	Silently except for the priests blowing on the ram's horns.
Who were the only people to be saved alive when the children of Israel defeated Jericho? Joshua 6:17	Rahab and her family.
What was to be done with all the silver, gold, brass and iron things found in Jericho? Joshua 6:19	They were to be consecrated (set apart) for the treasury of the Lord.
After the children of Israel defeated Jericho what did they do to the city? Joshua 6:24	They burned it.
After the great defeat of Jericho why	Because Achan took of the treasure that

was the Lord angry with the children of Israel. Joshua 7:1	was supposed to be set aside for the treasury.
What was the next city to be attacked after Jericho? Joshua 7:2	Ai
How many men did the spies think could defeat Ai? Joshua 7:3	Two or three thousand
Why did the spies think only a small number of men would be needed to defeat Ai? Joshua 7:3	Because there were not many people there.
What happened at the battle of Ai? Joshua 7:5	The children of Israel were defeated. They got scared and turned and ran.
What did Joshua do when he saw what had happened at Ai? Joshua 7:7	He asked God what happened.
What did God tell Joshua was the reason for their defeat at Ai? Joshua 7:11	Because someone in their camp had sinned by taking something from Jericho that they were not supposed to take.
What did God tell Joshua to do so that the children of Israel would once again be strong in battle? Joshua 7:13	To have the people consecrate themselves to God and get rid of the person who had sinned.
Who was found to be the one who had sinned and taken of the treasure that belonged to God? Joshua 7:18	Achan.
What did Achan take? Joshua 7:21	Clothing, silver, and gold
Where did Achan keep the stolen treasure? Joshua 7:21	In the earth under his tent.
What did Joshua and the children of Israel do to Achan? Joshua 7:24 – 25	They took him, his family and everything they owned and stoned them and then burned it all up.
After Achan's death what did God tell Joshua to do? Joshua 8:1	Go and defeat Ai.
What was the plan for defeating Ai? Joshua 8:5-8	They would turn and run as they had before only this time they would have an ambush set.
Did the plan for defeating Ai work? Joshua 8:26	Yes
Besides defeating Ai what else did God give them out of Ai?	The cattle and anything else they could find that they wanted.

Joshua 8:27	
After the defeat of Ai what did the children of Israel do? Joshua 8:31	They built an altar out of stones and offered burnt offerings and peace offerings unto the Lord.
After the defeat of both Jericho and Ai what did the kings of the rest of their enemy countries do? Joshua 9:2	They banded together to fight against the children of Israel.
What trick did the people of Gibeon pull on the children of Israel? Joshua 9:4 & 5	They pretended to be from a country far away by taking with them old food and old clothing and making it seem as if they had been traveling for a very long time.
What did they ask Joshua to promise them? Joshua 9:6	Make a league (or treaty) with us.
Did the Gibeonites trick work? Joshua 9:15	Yes
What did Joshua and children of Israel forget to do in dealing with the Gibeonites? Joshua 9:14	Ask God what they should do.
When Joshua and the children of Israel began to travel and see who they would come to next to defeat what did they find? Joshua 9:17	That Gibeon was only a short journey away. That the men from Gibeon had lied to them.
Did the children of Israel keep their promise to the Gibeonites? Joshua 9:18	Yes
What did the children of Israel do to the Gibeonites instead of defeating them? Joshua 9:21	They made them to be bondslaves.
When the rest of the enemy kings heard that Gibeon had made a pact with the children of Israel what did they do? Joshua 10:4 & 5	They decided to attack Gibeon.
When the enemy kings attacked Gibeon what did the Gibeonites do? Joshua 10: 6	They sent to Joshua and the children of Israel for help.
Did Joshua help the Gibeonites fight the enemy kings? Joshua 10:7	Yes
What did the Lord send to help defeat the enemy kings as they fought against Gibeon? Joshua 10:11	Hailstones
As Joshua was helping Gibeon defeat	Make the sun stand still and the moon stay

the enemy kings what did he ask God to do for him? Joshua 10:12	in it's place until they won.
What happened when Joshua asked for the sun and moon to stand still? Joshua 10:13	They stood still for a whole day.
As the enemy kings saw what was happening to their armies what did they do? Joshua 10:16	They fled to a cave.
What did Joshua do when he heard the kings were in a cave? Joshua 10:18	He had stones rolled in front of the cave so that the kings could not get out.
What countries did the five enemy kings represent? Joshua 10:23	Jerusalem, Hebron, Jarmuth, Lachish, and Eglon
After Joshua and the children of Israel finished defeating the enemy whose kings were hiding in caves what did Joshua do with the kings? Joshua 10:24-27	He took them out of the cave, killed them, hung them in five different trees for the rest of the day and then put them back in the cave and sealed the cave.
After the defeat of these five enemy countries what did Joshua and the children of Israel do? Joshua 10:28 – 11:22	They went on to defeat all the enemy countries that God told them to.
When all the enemy lands were taken what did Joshua do with all the lands?	He gave it for an inheritance to the children of Israel according to the division of their tribes and then rested from war.
Which tribe did not receive an inheritance of land? Joshua 13:33	The Levites (They were the priests.)
Why did the Levite tribe not receive an inheritance? Joshua 13:33	The Lord God of Israel was their inheritance.
How many tribes received an actual inheritance in the promised land? Joshua 14:2	Nine and one half
Where was the inheritance for the other two and one half tribes? Joshua 14:3	On the other side of the Jordan river.
Who are the tribes of Israel named after?	The twelve sons of Jacob / Israel
If the Levites did not get an inheritance how come there are still twelve tribes that receive an inheritance? Joshua 14:4	There is not a tribe named after Joseph instead, there are two tribes named after his sons. Manasseh and Ephraim.
Besides Joshua who was the only other original spy sent out by Moses	Caleb

to still be living when they entered the Promised Land?	
What did Moses promise Caleb? Joshua 14:9	The land that you stood on will be yours.
How old was Caleb when they had finally defeated all the enemies? Joshua 14:10	Fourscore and five years old (85)
What claim did Caleb make? Joshua 14:11	That he was as strong at 85 as he was when he originally went out as a spy.
What land did Caleb ask of Joshua? Joshua 14:12	Give me the mountain where the Anakims live (the giants live).
Why did Caleb ask for the mountain? Joshua 14:12	He knew the Lord would be with him and help him to defeat the Anakims (giants)
When they were finally settled in the Promised Land where did they set up the tabernacle? Joshua 18:1	Shiloh
After receiving the land of their inheritance what were the tribes supposed to go and do?	Drive out the rest of the inhabitants and take possession of the land for themselves.
Did the children of Israel all immediately depart and take possession of their inherited land? Joshua 18:2	No
How many tribes did not go and immediately take possession of their inherited land? Joshua 18:2	Seven
How was the decision made as to what land each of the seven remaining tribes received? Joshua 18:6	By lot (like drawing a number out of a basket)
Since the Levites did not receive an inheritance where did they live? Joshua 21:8	They were given cities out of the possession of the other tribes.
Did any of God's promises to the children of Israel fail to happen? Joshua 21:45	No
Once the children of Israel had rest from their enemies and their land was divided what did Joshua tell the tribes of Reuben, Gad and the half tribe of Manasseh. Joshua 22:4	Go back to the other side of the Jordan and take possession of your land now.
What warning did Joshua give to the	Remember to do all that Moses charged us

tribes that would live on the other side of the Jordan river? Joshua 22:5	to do, (quote) “to love the Lord your God and to walk in all his ways and to keep his commandments.”
What was one of Joshua’s final reminders to the children of Israel? Joshua 23:6	QUOTE “Be ye therefore very courageous to keep and to do all that is written in the book of the law of Moses, that ye turn not aside therefrom to the right hand or to the left;”
According to Joshua how are we to serve the Lord? Joshua 24:14	In sincerity and in truth.
In Joshua’s last talk with the children of Israel what did he challenge them to do? Joshua 24:15	QUOTE “Choose you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the flood or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell; but as for me and my house we will serve the Lord.”
How did the children of Israel respond to Joshua’s challenge? Joshua 24:24	QUOTE “And the people said unto Joshua, The Lord our God will we serve, and his voice will we obey.”
How old was Joshua when he died? Joshua 24:29	110
Whose bones had the children of Israel brought out of Egypt to bury in the Promised Land? Joshua 24:32	Joseph’s

How many chapters are there in the book of Joshua? 24
