What was Goliath's plan for fighting their war?	He would fight one man from Israel's army, if Goliath won, Israel would be Philistine's servants and if the chosen one from Israel won, then the Philistines would be their servants. (17:8 & 9)
How did Saul feel about Goliath's plan?	He was dismayed and greatly afraid. (17:11)
How many times did Goliath challenge Israel's army?	Morning and evening for forty days. (17:16)
Why did David go to the place of the battle?	His father asked him to take his brothers some food. (17:17 & 18)
What did the men in Israel's army do each time Goliath presented his challenge?	They ran away from him because they were afraid. (17:24)
David did not understand why no one would fight Goliath. What question did he ask his brothers?	"Is there not a cause?" (17:29)
What did David tell King Saul he was willing to do?	Fight Goliath. (17:32)
Why did David feel qualified to go after Goliath?	He had already killed a lion and a bear while watching his father's sheep. (17:34 & 35)
To whom did David give credit for his ability to fight the lion and bear?	God. (17:37)
What did Saul offer David to help him fight Goliath?	His own armour. (17:38)
Instead of Saul's armour what did David choose to fight Goliath with?	Five smooth stones and a sling. (17:40)
What did Goliath do when he saw a young boy coming out to fight him?	He cursed David. (17:43)

What did David say to Goliath?	“Thou comest to me with a sword, and with a spear, and with a shield: but I come to thee in the name of the Lord of hosts” (17:45)
What did David promise Goliath?	That God would deliver Goliath into David’s hand. (17:46)
How many stones did it take to kill Goliath?	1 (17:50)
What did the Philistines do when they saw Goliath was dead?	They ran away. (17:51)
Who became David’s best friend?	Jonathan, King Saul’s son (18:1)
Why did King Saul become jealous of David?	The people were beginning to sing David’s praises instead of King Saul’s praises. (18:7 & 8)
Saul became so jealous of David that he threw what at him?	His javelin. (18:11)
Why did David finally leave King Saul’s palace?	King Saul kept trying to kill David. (Chapter 18, 19 and 20)
Since Jonathan could not be the next king what did he ask David to promise?	Always be kind to my family and don’t cut them off (kill them), even when I am dead. (20:14 & 15)
When David needed a sword to protect himself, what did Ahimelech the priest give him?	Goliath’s sword. (21:9)
Where did David go to hide from King Saul?	The cave of Adullam (22:1)
What two things did David do to King Saul to let him know that he could have killed him if he had wanted too?	He cut off the back of King Saul’s robe and he took his water bottle and spear (Chapters 24 & 26)
Why did David say he would not kill Saul?	“The Lord forbid that I should stretch forth mine hand against the Lord’s anointed...” (26:11A)
How did Saul finally die?	He was hit with an arrow and

	then he fell on his own sword. (31:3 & 5)
When David heard of Saul and Jonathan's deaths what did he do?	He mourned and wept and fasted. (II Samuel 1:12)
Who became King after Saul?	David (II Samuel 2:4)
Quote Ephesians 2: 8 & 9	For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast.
Quote II Timothy 2:15	Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.
